We are planning a day of fun for the whole family. To complement the 'fun' atmosphere we are having a judged open show for fruits, veggies, flowers and floral designs. We will even have Junior Classes for children 12 and under to introduce them to growing and showing their own produce.

Ribbons for 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes will be given. In addition to that we will be giving Gift Certificates for 'Best Vegetable', 'Best Fruit', 'Best Flower', 'Best Floral Design', 'Best Junior Entry' and 'Best In Show'.

The entry classes and descriptions are on the following pages. As this is our first show, and maybe yours too, we are relaxing the judging criteria, slightly, to gently get our feet wet. Go through your garden and figure out what you have growing that you can enter.

Please read these over carefully.

RULES:

1. Entry Form must be faxed or brought in to Buckerfields by 5:00 p.m., Saturday, August 14th.
2. All fruit, vegetables and flowers **must** be grown by the person entering them. You cannot enter purchased items.
Exception: Floral Design classes.
3. **Only one exhibit per class per individual. APPLIES TO ALL DIVISIONS.**
4. Staging begins at 8:30 a.m.
5. Entries must be in place by 10:00 a.m.
6. Judging begins at 10:30 a.m.
7. Public viewing of entries begins at 12:00 noon.
8. Entries must be removed between 4:00 - 4:30 p.m. Saturday, August 21st.

Class:	83	"A Tisket A Tasket". A design made in a basket with one handle. Handle to be visible. Maximum size 18" long x 24" tall.
Class:	84	"At The Beach" a design featuring driftwood.
Class:	85	"Memory Lane" a design using an antique container
Class:	86	"Itsy Bitsy" a miniature arrangement not to exceed 5" in any direction.

**TIPS:**

- Don't have a plate that is too large or too small for the items you are exhibiting. Exhibits should be displayed on a plate in a balanced fashion. Can be a paper plate or whatever you wish. Try to make sure the plate colour does not clash with your exhibit but compliments it.
- When exhibiting a class with more than one item, (5 pods, green beans) try to keep the size of the items in the grouping roughly the same. You shouldn't have one green bean quite a bit longer than the rest or one really small one and the rest the same size. Balance in size and colour is best.
- Points will be taken off for bug damage, so if you have a head of lettuce and some of the outside leaves show insect damage, try to discreetly remove the damaged leaf.
- If exhibiting in pots, make sure the pots are clean.
- When exhibiting in vases make sure the colour of the vase doesn't clash or take attention away from your flowers.
- When exhibiting fruit, make sure they are all the same ripeness, you don't want to see one under ripe strawberry on a plate with four ripe ones.
- Green onions should have their root trimmed but still visible. The tops should not be trimmed.
- Blueberries should still have the 'blush' on them, they should not be washed off.
- Dish Garden - Junior Class - is usually a plant tray or saucer that is used as the base.
